



Note: Estimated number of people (aged 15-64) who used drugs in the past year.







FIG. 6 Quantities of cannabis herb seized and reported trends in cannabis herb trafficking, 2009–2019



151 countries report cannabis cultivation (97% of global population)







FIG. 1 Global coca bush cultivation and cocaine manufacture, 1998–2019


MAP 6 Main cocaine trafficking flows, as described by reported seizures, 2015–2019




- Cocaine market expansion
- Price reduction

- Traffic chains diversification (more actors and higher levels of competition)



The drug markets resilience and, in particular, the cocaine market trends allow us to question, based on the available empirical evidence, even with its limitations, the international drug control regime assumptions since law enforcement efforts do not seem to have a real impact on the size of illicit markets and the drugs availability.



Need to develop new indicators in order to evaluate the outcomes and impact of drug control policies



Both the range of drugs and drugs markets are expanding and diversifying

The abuse, illicit cultivation and production and manufacture of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, as well as the illicit trafficking in those substances and in precursors, have reached record levels


